

School of Fine and Applied Arts, Bangkok University

Bangkok University realizes that the body of knowledge related to arts and design contributes to the development of economics and culture. Thus, it has the concept of offering education related to arts and design. The School of Fine and Applied Arts, Bangkok University was founded on 5 June B.E. 2532 being the 8th School of the University. Initially, it offered 2 undergraduate programs including interior design and visual communication design. This has been updated in response to the modern trends and needs of the workforce. At present, it offers 4 undergraduate degrees including visual communication design, visual arts, fashion design and product design. The interior design major has been transferred to the Faculty of Architecture since its inception in B.E. 2555.

Further, the School has a mission to promote learning in the field of art and culture. Since Bangkok University has started the Bangkok University Gallery project to be the place for art exhibition and various activities in B.E. 2539, the University has been assigned to take responsibility for such project until now. Bangkok University Gallery is recognized nationally and internationally as a gallery that promotes contemporary art and culture. It is also a place of learning resources in valuable art and culture of the society.

The School has its own color of lotus leaf pink. Its administration since its inception has included 5 Deans Ajarn Yonsakrit Charuburana, Associate Professor Sumitra Sriwibul, Assistant Professor Sansern Milintasut, Assistant Professor Dr. Piyaluck Benchadol and Dr. Patarawut Sapyet respectively.
